Meredith Public Library Celebrates the 125th Anniversary of Its Historic Building

On June 17, 1901, the people of Meredith gathered to dedicate what was then called the B.M. Smith Memorial Library; a magnificent gift from former resident Benjamin M. Smith in honor of his parents, John and Mary Smith.

The original article published in *The Meredith News* described the event as one of the most important civic celebrations in the town's history. Meredith was decorated for the occasion, and distinguished guests arrived by train from across New Hampshire and Massachusetts to participate in the ceremonies.

Benjamin M. Smith shared the story of his early years in Meredith and the hardships his family endured after financial losses in the 1850s. Unable to perform hard labor due to illness, Smith began traveling door to door selling yarn purchased by his father on credit. That modest beginning became the foundation of a successful business career that eventually enabled him to give back to the town that shaped him.

During the dedication, Smith paid tribute to the values his parents instilled in him — honesty, hard work, and perseverance — stating that without those lessons he could never have achieved success. He then formally presented the keys of the library to the Town of Meredith.

Among the honored guests was U.S. Senator Jacob Gallinger, who praised Smith's generosity and reminded attendees that although Smith had left Meredith as a poor young man, he had never forgotten his hometown. Other speakers reflected on the importance of education, literacy, and public libraries in strengthening both individuals and communities.

The original article described the library as a modern and impressive structure. Finished in brown ash, the building included a reading room, trustees' room, conversation hall, book stacks capable of holding 24,000 volumes, electric lighting, hot air heat, and even a fireproof vault for town records. A bronze tablet inside the building commemorated Smith's parents,

One speaker described the library as “a golden step of progress in our village history,” expressing hope that its doors would remain open to all who sought knowledge and enlightenment.

Over the past 125 years, the Meredith Public Library has continued to evolve while remaining true to that original vision. Today, the library serves not only as a center for books and learning, but also as Meredith’s living room and cultural heart; a welcoming gathering place for education, creativity, technology, history, and community connection.

As we celebrate the 125th anniversary of the library building, we honor the generosity of Benjamin M. Smith, the dedication of generations of library staff and trustees, and the enduring importance of public libraries in civic life. The vision established in 1901 continues to guide and inspire the Meredith Public Library today.

REDCOATS & REBELS:

NEW HAMPSHIRE AND THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

New Hampshire often gets overlooked in the narrative of the American Revolution, overshadowed by its noisy neighbor to the south.

Few people know about Paul Revere's first ride, which was to Portsmouth in December 1774 to warn the patriots that the British were coming to reinforce Fort William and Mary, five months before Concord and Lexington. Nor do they know that two-thirds of the troops at the Battle of Bunker Hill were from New Hampshire.

NH native Mary Adams has always loved surrounding herself with history. Her passion for storytelling led her to become a tour guide at various locations, including San Francisco, Boston, and her favorite, Glacier National Park. Currently, Mary serves as Operations Manager for The Pursuit of History Weekends, where she coordinates specially curated, one-of-a-kind experiences aimed at inspiring broader public engagement with history. She is also on staff at the New Hampshire Historical Society.

UNSOLVED NEW ENGLAND MURDER MYSTERY: THE SMUTTYNOSE ISLAND AXE MURDERS



Kim Fallon, retired Chief Forensic Investigator at the NH Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, shares the details of the infamous Smuttnose Island axe murders of 1873 in nearby Kittery, Maine.
