If She Can't Find It, Nobody Can (A Talk with Always Affable Inter-Library Loan Librarian Cherie Gable) by Matthew Buteau, Adult Services Librarian

sion a while back interviewing our colleague Cherie about her background, time working at the library, and her current position in charge of Inter-Library Loans (abbreviated as ILL).

Cherie's pleasant demeanor and helpful attitude are well-known to Meredith residents as she has been working at the library for 16 years! (In fact, there's something of a Gable Dynasty at the library since her mother-in-law worked here for many years and Cherie's daughter now works at the library too.)

Cherie began by describing her background. She is a lifetime New Hampshire resident, originally hailing from the Newfound Lake area. Her undergraduate degree is in business and she later earned her MBA. Cherie previously worked at Freudenberg, an international company with a location in Bristol, NH. There. Cherie worked in Accounts Receivable dealing with many different companies. Her largest account was Ford Motor Company.

I spent a fun and informative ses- After taking time off to raise two children, Cherie returned to the workforce by joining the staff at the Meredith Public Library where she has been ever since. She began her career at the library as a Library Aide doing the "grunt work" as she explained and later spending a lot of time working in the Children's Room. Over a decade ago, she took on her present position of working with Inter-Library Loans. Cherie explains, "When our library does not own an item (and it's not a brand new item. generally meaning older than six months), we can go out and borrow it from any other library in the state." Available items include: books, DVDs, magazines, and even academic articles from college libraries.

> There are 234 public libraries in New Hampshire. Cherie told us that there are about 200 which participate in the ILL system in NH. I asked her how that all works logistically considering New Hampshire towns and libraries stretch from the Canadian border to the Massachusetts border. Continued on page 3

Cherie explained that she enters the requests in an Internet-based system. The system uses various factors to determine which library the request will be sent to first. These factors include geographical proximity and library size. Requested items are sent via van delivery routes to the NH State Library where everything is sorted and rerouted to the receiving library. The Meredith Library gets three van drop off/pick up visitations per week. Depending on the timing and location of the materials, it can take up to two weeks for them to make their way from one library to another.

"How important is it for people to return their Inter-Library Loan materials on time?" she was asked. Cherie acknowledged that was a great question and elaborated, "It's very important because we want to keep a good relationship with the other libraries. If we have overdue things, they're not going to want to lend us their items if we are consistently late."

Patrons can put in ILL requests in several ways. They can ask at the circulation desk and a librarian will fill out the request form. People can also visit the library website and fill out a form there. They can also email Cherie at ILL@MeredithLibrary.org or call the library to relay their requests.

Towards the end of the conversation, we discussed an important note for anyone who has taken out Inter-Library Loan materials. They should always be returned to the library that handed the materials to the patron. It is actually not helpful for patrons to bring them back to the library that owns them as that causes more work in the background.


